The University of Southern California has an extraordinary capacity to improve community health around the world and is committed to implementing trans-

disciplinary approaches within A Nossa Casa. The USC Institute of Global Health is responsible for harnessing the extraordinary breadth of USC to create this prototype that will be replicated around the world to secure futures for children orphaned by AIDS.

## A NOSSA CASA : A HOME FOR US

In partnership with local Mozambican NGO Reencontro, AMF is committed to constructing a sustainable village, A Nossa Casa, where children orphaned by AIDS can regain hope for their futures through social services and assistance. A Nossa Casa, which means "our house, will offer holistic care within a nurturing environment where children may reach their individual and collective potential. The sustainable village will not only impact the children of Mozambique, but also provide a replication model that can be used by third-world countries worldwide that are facing the devastation of AIDS.



**Education:** Primary and secondary education will be available on site with seven classrooms capable of holding 28 children each.

**Health:** A medical clinic specializing in providing care for children will offer help through various service.

**Food & Nutrition:** Children will receive three nutritious meals a day which will be sustained through a designated plot of land .

**Vocational Training:** Classes will equip and empower children with the skills and opportunity to provide for themselves.
